Member Reappointed to Shetland NHS Board

The Cabinet Secretary for Health and Sport, Jeane Freeman MSP today announced the reappointment of Natasha Cornick as a Member of Shetland NHS Board.

MEMBER

Natasha Cornick was appointed to Shetland NHS Board in July 2017 following a background of working in the legal sector. During her time on the Board, Natasha has Chaired both the NHS Shetland Audit Committee and Shetland Integration Joint Board; and has sat as a member of various governance committees including the Clinical Care and Professional Governance Committee and Staff Governance Committee. She has also been involved in recognising staff achievements within NHS Shetland having sat on the panels for both Staff Development Awards since 2018 and Excellence in Care Awards in 2019 and 2020. Natasha currently sits as Vice Chair of Shetland Integration Joint Board and has a strong commitment to assist in strengthening joint working across Shetland Health and Social Care Partnership.

REAPPOINTMENT

This reappointment will be for four years and will run from 10th July 2021 to 9th July 2025.

This reappointment is regulated by the Ethical Standards Commissioner.

REMUNERATION

This reappointment is part-time and attracts a remuneration of £8.095 per annum for a time commitment of one day per week.

OTHER MINISTERIAL APPOINTMENTS

Natasha Cornick does not hold any other ministerial public appointments.

POLITICAL ACTIVITY

All appointments are made on merit and political activity plays no part in the selection process. However, in accordance with the original Nolan recommendations, there is a requirement for appointees' political activity within the last five years (if there is any to be declared) to be made public.

Natasha Cornick has had no political activity within the last five years.

BACKGROUND

NHS Shetland is responsible for meeting the health needs and improving the health of around 23,000 people living in the Shetland Islands. NHS Shetland employs approximately 620 staff and provides a comprehensive range of acute, mental health, primary and community services.
