

The Scottish Government Healthier Fish and Shellfish

Chair

Randolph Richards (Former Director; Inst of Aquaculture, Stirling University)

Issues / priorities

- Creation of a national system for the collection of sea-lice and mortality data (rec. by end of December 2009).
- Development of an improved strategy for control of sea-lice taking account of integrated sea-lice management approaches including effective sampling protocols and appropriate treatment interventions (rec. by end of March 2010).
- Delineation of appropriate scale management areas for all of Scotland to allow single year class stocking, simultaneous fallowing and area treatments (rec. by end of March 2010).
- Three smaller scale working subgroups now established



★ The Scottish Government Healthier Fish and Shellfish Possible research requirements

- Extend armoury of treatment products
- Better understanding of patterns of resistance in different areas
- Hydrological information?
- MoU with Norway making it "live"
- Other priorities remain e.g. alphavirus





Improved Systems for Licensing Aquaculture Developments

Chair

Phil Thomas (Chair; Scottish Salmon Producers' Organisation)

Issues / Priorities

- Support "Delivering Planning Reform for Aquaculture" process
- Encourage dialogue between industry and regulators (and regulator to regulator)
- Undeveloped Leases Maximise the use of available sites
- Revise locational guidelines nitrogen content, digestibility, wastage of feed
- Modelling for larger sites discharge consents

Research requirements

- Focussed on streamlining bureaucracy. However some work required around:
 - -Modelling discharges from larger sites (industry and SEPA)
 - -Revision of locational guidelines (MSS supported by industry)



Improved Containment

Chair

Steve Bracken (Business Support Manager; Marine Harvest, Scotland Ltd)

Issues / priorities

- Escapes caused by human error need for improved training and qualifications in this area
- Use of inappropriate equipment, inappropriate combinations of equipment, poor maintenance
- Narrow range of Acoustic Deterrent devices for predators, can lose efficacy
- Time-lag between hole in net and discovery
- Perceived impact of freshwater escapes on wild stocks



The Scottish Government Improved Containment

Possible research requirements

- Develop a Scottish technical standard (similar to Norwegian NYTEK) – freshwater and marine
- Trial new net types
- Review and if necessary develop the causes of escapes project (SARF)
- Review impacts of freshwater smolt production
- Consider pros and cons of land-based/ recirculation technologies
- Review/ develop methods for traceability of escapees
- Review current position on use of Triploidy
- Develop "magic eye" or net tension sensor to provide early warning of holes
- Develop ADDs





Better Marketing & Improved Image

Chair

Scott Landsburgh (Chief Executive; Scottish Salmon Producers' Organisation

Issues / priorities

- Address negative misconceptions amongst key opinion formers
 Raise the profile of the industry in Scotland
 Communicate key health messages
 Secure the Scottish premium

Possible research requirements

- Survey of key groups to develop a Clearer understanding of perceptions and misconceptions
- Better international market intelligence
- Research into the economic and social contribution of the industry, especially in remote and rural communities
- Analysis of the carbon footprint of aquaculture compared to the production of other forms of protein





Access to Finance

Chair

David Bassett (Chief Executive; British Trout Association)

Issues / priorities

- Poor Historic Profitability Profile
- Financing of SMEs / collateral / borrowing
- Relationship of Insurance and Investment
- Clearing Bank Engagement
- Lack of appropriate data





Access to Finance

Possible research requirements

- Commission Data Survey
- Ongoing annual production, developing the EC Data Regulation requirements
- Shellfish Fisheries 2010 (SARF)
- Economic Analysis and scope for Market Potential (in association with Marketing and Image group) e.g. WAG initiative
- Provision of a concise summary of production statistics and value for Scottish Aquaculture and Fisheries
- Considering the Norwegian example

Issues / priorities

- Protection of water quality
 Harmonisation of FSA and SEPA led regulatory regimes
 Greater focus on influencing EU legislation as it affects
- shellfish
- The question of unused shellfish consents
