I am aware the responses have to be in by today, 10 January, so I am
emailing that from Morar Community Council instead of a letter.

There are three main points of concern regarding the consultation, namely:

- 1] The impact on fishing on which local industry depends.
- 2] The impact on housing and development in our villages. This is an
underpopulated and underdeveloped area of scarcely viable communities and
adding more layers of bureaucracy will have a detrimental effect.
- 3] Scant attention has been paid to local opinion. A 'caravan' was
apparently present in Mallaig for a couple of days but most people were
unaware of its presence. If it had been advertised it hadn't been widely
done and certainly not locally. Comments from those who did visit indicated
that the personel manning it were unable to answer more searching questions
which are the ones which are of major concern to the population.
