Subject: The Licensing (Relevant Offences) (Scotland) Regulations 2007

This email has been received from an external party and has been swept for the presence of computer viruses.

Dear Sirs,

I wish to comment on the above draft regulations as part of the consultation process which I understand closes on 14th September 2007.

Part 2(10) of the Schedule includes as a "relevant offence" an offence under 7(2) of the Gaming Act 1968. Notwithstanding the fact that this offence is provided for in an enactment which will no longer be in force as of 1st September 2007 (and I note Reg 2(b) (i) and (ii)), you have catered for the relevant provision under the new Gambling Act 2005 at Part 2(39) of the schedule.

It seems to me that given the inclusion of Part2(39), Part2(10) is redundant and should be deleted.
