Response to Consultation on Relevant Offences

The schedule attached to the draft Regulations appears very comprehensive. The consultation asks whether or not aiding and abetting, procuring or inciting a relevant offence should also be taken into account. It is considered that they should, as they equally strike at the suitability of a person to hold a licence. In some cases this may be particularly relevant, for instance, procuring a third party to provide alcohol to a young person.
