

Consultation on Planning Enforcement Regulations

- Q1 Yes
- Q2 For large developments the fines are insignificant
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- Q4 Make sure it is not a developer hiding behind someone else or another company.
- Q5 If, during a development, the supplied information became invalid, then an update of the information must be supplied.
- Q6 Web site where it can be easily seen on line.
- Q7 Minor developments must also show notices. These should be alongside where the planning application notice was posted. Enforcement officers would only need to sample some to let small developers know they could be checked. Perhaps notified neighbours should be advised and allowed to check.
- Q8 Notices could be served on paper that could then be sealed eg by laminating. State that notice should remain clear whilst in force, water and weather proof and located at a safe and prominent point on or close to the site that can be viewed easily by the public.

- Q10 Where stopping work would result in a dangerous situation whether actual or potential.
