Encourage athletes and tourists to travel the length and breadth of Scotland whilst in the country. Important not to just consult with young people involved with Young Scot and Dialogue Youth - also need views from secondary school pupils and more choices, more chances people as well. Use of Sporting Champions - get Scottish athletes to tour Scotland to help inspire all communities - starting with those involved in Beijing. Increase number of Sports Development Officers now so ready for projected increase in participation levels. Many SD posts in Scotland changing to Active Communities so sports focus changing.</p>
<p>Question 3: QUESTION 3: How can we, individually or collectively, best achieve these aims?</p>	<p>Production of a booklet for 2014 that promotes all events across Scotland in the run up to, during and after the Games to encourage visitors to Scotland to visit places outwith Glasgow for example walking festivals in the Highlands, Highland Games etc. Need to tie in the Volunteer Accreditation Scheme with Volunteer Centre Network Scotland so that people volunteering at the Games can hopefully continue volunteering long term. LA"s to focus on Commonwealth and Olympic Sports. Delivering courses for unemployed Scots to train them up in areas that will be needed for the Games. Keep remembering that funding still needs to be channelled into increasing participation and not just at excellence level for these Games - as that is the way that the Games will have a legacy at the end of it if more people get more active! Support people from across the whole of Scotland to be involved in the Games and not just those from the Central Belt. Try to involve as many people in Scotland as possible during the fortnight of the Games so that they experience it in person and be proud of what Scotland can deliver - show that passion that we are renowned for!! Which will inspire them to go home and get active!</p>
