
PENTLAND FIRTH AND ORKNEY WATERS MARINE SPATIAL PLAN: PLANNING ISSUES AND OPTIONS PAPER

Consultation Response: Pentland Canoe Club

On behalf of the Pentland Canoe Club, in Thurso, please find attached our response to the Pentland Firth and Orkney Waters Marine Spatial. Additionally we would like to make the following points

- Recreational activities such as kayaking, surfing etc need to be given their own individual status as a sector and should be consulted
- The Club would like to be included in the forthcoming Leisure & tourism consultation study which is due to be undertaken later this year.
- The majority of our activities are undertaken adjacent to the coastline and there
 needs to be a navigable channel maintained. Obstacles / exclusion zones could force
 kayaks away from the coastline and into unfavourable / dangerous environmental
 conditions (tidal streams / offshore winds etc). Rights of passage / navigation also need
 to be maintained between the coastline and offshore islands.

Comments Scotland has been promoting venture tourism. The area offer great potential for water based adventure tourism in particular surfing (board and kayak). Over these activities are increasing across Scotland.

Sea kayaking: Scotland has a reputation as a world class destination for sea kayaking. The Pentland Firth and Orkney waters are some of the most challenging in the UK. Guide books have been written (Scottish Sea Kayaking – Fifty Great Sea Kayaking Voyages; the Northern Isles – Orkney & Shetland Sea Kayaking) and new ones to be published highlight trips to be undertaken by visitors to the area. The some of the areas of the Pentland Firth are very challenging and offer challenges to sea kayakers in the same way as mountaineering on some of the world's most challenging mountains.

Surfing: The areas around Caithness offer some of the best surfing breaks in the world. Major sporting competitions have taken place in the area including a number of world championships for kayak surfing.

Comments

The interaction between recreation/tourism and marinine renewables should =be a major interaction. During the installation and operation & maintenance phases

there will be significantly increased shipping activity in the area. A full deployment there could be on average 1 device per day being removed from the water for planned maintenance. The activity for unplanned maintenance is unknown. This will increase the shipping hazard significantly to recreational water users in particular sail and kayaking). There is also a potential increase in noise pollution (eg during installation) which could impact on tourism.
