We would like to comment on the following proposals:

- 2. Business Competitiveness the link in to employability needs to be stressed.
- 5. Scotland's 8th City further emphasis should be placed on broadening out this approach to the wider city regions.
- 7. Low Carbon Travel & Transport the links to better access to job opportunities should be made.
- 10. Enhanced Employability Pipelines & Youth Employment Scotland the focus should be on all 5 stages of the strategic skills pipeline. It needs to be clear what can be delivered at stage 5 as potential overlap with proposal 1 (Developing Scotland's Workforce). The links to job creation and Business Competitiveness theme should be highlighted.
- 11. Poverty and Social Inclusion there needs to be strong links between services at stages 1 and 2 of the strategic skills pipeline. Opportunity to create stronger links between the third sector and local pipelines.

Question 2 – Section 6 sets out the linkages between Structural, Rural and Fisheries Funds as well as linkages to other EU Funding Programmes. We would welcome stakeholder comments on these linkages in order to help us develop this thinking further

We have concerns about the lead authority model being suggested for the Enhanced Employability Pipeline and Youth Employment Scotland proposal under the Inclusive heading. CPPs are already managing complex, multi partner programmes which are designed to meet local needs and each CPP area has its own individual pipeline stru and employment market. Having a lead authority for a number of CPP areas would be costly for leads to manage and would cause major delays in payments to delivery organisations if claims had to be aggregated firstly at local CPP level and then furthe aggregated at lead CPP level.
