Cross Boundary Working in relation to Specialist Services

While it is appreciated that the way that all services in scope are configured will be the subject of the Integration Scheme and Strategic Plans, Officers would be grateful for further guidance on how it is envisaged how a range of specialist services such as paediatrics and allied health professionals will operate in the future if they presently have an input in delivering services in more than one partnership area.

Pharmaceutical Services-GP Prescribing

Council would like to see a greater acknowledgement of the proportionally higher financial risk for smaller partnerships areas when the budget moves from NHS Boards to the Integrated Joint Boards. We would also seek clarification on how these risks can be realistically be addressed.

Women's Health Services

Guidance would be appreciated in relation to how this service can be disaggregated and reconfigured locally (and if this is the intention).
