Information Sharing and data handling - we would suggest that an emphasis is placed on 'personal data' with the Prescribed Information being on the development of 'Joint Protocol' in this respect.

Complaints - we would suggest that as customer feedback, the value of comments and compliments are included, as well as appropriate arrangements to manage them.

Arrangements for complaints should be focused on the establishment of a 'Joint Complaints Handling Procedure', which would serve anyone who wishes to make a complaint about health and/or social care services, in line with existing respective legislation governing health and social care complaints. The report by the Short Life Working Group on Review of Social Work Complaints which was submitted to the Scottish Government recently would help expedite the integration of health and social care complaints procedures. In any event, simply integrating complaints functions is not adequate by itself; Regulations for a 'Duty to Co-operate' have proved quite useful south of the border in terms of the investigation of complaints involving both health and social care services.

Independent Advocacy Services - a streamlined approach to funding the development of a single advocacy service should be considered.
