1) Changing your legal sex is a significant step, both for the person themselves and for their family, as sell as social/ work contacts.

The current requirement to live for a min of two years as a person of the alternative gender allows time for the person themselves to determine if they do wish to permanently live as someone of the other gender. Three months is not enough time for this to be demonstrated.
