CONSULTATION ON THE DRAFT SCOTTISH MARINE REGIONS ORDER 2013

1. Thank you for taking the time to consider this consultation paper. The Marine (Scotland) Act 2010 introduces statutory marine planning for the first time in the Scottish marine area. The Act provides for a National Marine Plan and for the delegation of marine planning functions to a regional level. Scottish Ministers have the power to designate and identify the boundaries of Scottish Marine Regions through secondary legislation, and your input will help ensure that this legislation is as required.

Previous consultation

- 2. We consulted on the identification and designation of an appropriate set of Scottish Marine Regions to implement marine planning at a regional level in Scotland. The public consultation 'Scottish Marine Regions, Defining their boundaries' was held from November 2010 to February 2011. http://scotland.gov.uk/Publications/2010/11/22125407/0
- 3. The consultation document sought views on:
 - the general principle of creating Scottish Marine Regions (SMRs) for regional marine planning
 - seaward limits of Scottish marine boundaries
 - planning for Strategic Sea Areas not included in SMRs being included in the National Marine Plan
 - alignment of marine boundaries

- three main options for identifying SMRs: 1) physical characteristics; 2) existing administrative models; and 3) physical characteristics with two west coast regions and varied east coast boundaries.
- 4. The consultation document was published on the Scottish Government website and distributed directly to key stakeholders with a known interest in the issue. Scottish Government officials also presented the consultation at twelve public meetings in coastal communities organised by Scotland's Local Coastal Partnerships, which were attended by a range of stakeholders.
- 5. A total of 81 written responses were received. An analysis of the responses which also contains key themes raised at the public meetings can be found at:

6. The results of the consultation concluded that there was strong support for the creation of Scottish Marine Regions, and that the preferred option for marine region boundaries was option 3 which was based on physical characteristics but with modification to ensure marine regions were not too large on the west and east coast. This option would create 11 marine regions. The draft Scottish Marine Regions Order 2013 as attached is a result of the responses to the public consultation 'Scottish Marine Regions, Defining their boundaries'.

Content of the Order

- 7. The Scottish Marine Regions Order 2013 as drafted delivers the option in paragraph 6 above, but with some variation to the boundaries that were originally illustrated in the consultation document. For example, the seaward limits of Scottish territorial waters (12 nautical miles from baseline) was not given as an option for the extent of the regions but there was sufficient support from the public events and responses to the consultation to accept 12 nautical miles as the limit. The consultation also indicated only limited support for excluding suggested Strategic Sea Areas and therefore these are included within the regions set out in the Order.
- 8. Similarly, certain boundaries were adjusted as a result of consultee responses. These include:
 - Local Authority Marine Planning Zone boundaries¹ used between Highland, Argyll and Bute and the Western Isles.
 - Local Authority Marine Planning Zone boundaries used between Dumfries and Galloway and South Ayrshire.
 - Local Authority Marine Planning Zone boundaries used between Aberdeenshire and Angus.
 - Fraserburgh included within the same Marine Region as Peterhead.
- 9. The draft Order identifies the 11 proposed Scottish Marine Regions and establishes their boundaries. The co-ordinates are based on boundaries set in The Scottish Adjacent Waters Boundary Order 1999; The Town and Country Planning (Marine Fish Farming) (Scotland) Order 2007 which defines Marine Planning Zones

for local authorities; and other existing digital maps. The landward boundary is Mean High Water Spring tide and the extension of the boundaries out to the 12 nautical mile limit is based on the Territorial Sea Act 1987.

- 10. Due to the number of coordinates required to identify the regions, an illustrative map has also been prepared and is included within the draft Order.
- 11. An illustration of the proposed boundaries will also be available on NMPi Marine Scotland's interactive marine planning tool. This will show a projection of the co-ordinates, which can then be downloaded to stakeholders' own systems once the Order is in force. The detailed spreadsheets containing the co-ordinate numbers will also be available.

Scope of consultation

- 12. This consultation document is on the identification and establishment of the Scottish Marine Regions in legislation only.
- 13. Further discussions with stakeholders regarding the formation of Marine Planning Partnerships will be held after the legislation setting out the boundaries is in force.
- 14. Marine Scotland is considering approaches to developing regional marine planning and is currently working with local authorities in Highland and Orkney, and other interested parties, to develop a marine spatial plan for the Pentland Firth and Orkney waters. It is anticipated that the products of this work would feed into future regional plans. Marine Scotland has also recently appointed a regional marine planning officer in Oban, working with local interests to assist in the development of planning for the Argyll region, and is liaising with interested parties in a number of other localities to discuss possible governance arrangements.

Your views

- 15. We would welcome your views on the proposals in The Scottish Marine Regions Order 2013. We would particularly welcome your comments on: the Order as drafted; the co-ordinates establishing the marine region boundaries; the names of the regions suggested; and the illustrative map.
- 16. We would particularly welcome views on the boundaries outlined at paragraph 8 above, as these have changed from the previous consultation and we are aware there remains a range of views.
- 17. Please note that the closing date for this consultation is 28 February 2013.

As it will be subject to affirmative parliamentary procedure it will come into force only following its approval by resolution of the Parliament. It is anticipated that the soonest the Order would come into force is May 2013.

The Scottish Ministers make the following Order in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 5(5) and 165(1) of the Marine (Scotland) Act 2010(a) and all other powers enabling them to do so.

In accordance with section 165(5)(**b**) of the Marine (Scotland) Act 2010, a draft of this instrument has been laid before and approved by resolution of the Scottish Parliament.

Citation, commencement and interpretation

- **1.** This Order may be cited as the Scottish Marine Regions Order 2013 and comes into force on the day after the day on which it is made.
 - 2. In this Order—
 - "co-ordinate" means a co-ordinate of latitude or longitude according to the World Geodetic System 1984 (WGS 84)(c);
 - "line" means a geodesic line; and
 - "MHWS" means the level of the mean high water spring tide.

The Scottish marine region for the South West

- **3.**—(1) That part of the Scottish marine area(**d**) described in this article is designated as a Scottish marine region to be known as 'the Scottish marine region for the South West'.
- (2) The boundaries of the part of the Scottish marine area designated by paragraph (1) are identified in paragraphs (3) to (5).

The Scottish marine region for Moray

- 11.—(1) That part of the Scottish marine area described in this article is designated as a Scottish marine region to be known as 'the Scottish marine region for Moray'.
- (2) The boundaries of the part of the Scottish marine area designated by paragraph (1) are identified in paragraphs (3) to (6).
- (3) It is bounded to the west by the MHWS of the mainland of Scotland between the coordinates $58^{\circ}38'37''$ north latitude, $03^{\circ}01'26''$ west longitude and $57^{\circ}41'36''$ north latitude, $02^{\circ}03'02''$ west longitude.
- (4) It is bounded to the north by the line joining the co-ordinates 58°38′37″ north latitude, 03°01′26″ west longitude and 58°38′46″ north latitude, 02°30′46″ west longitude.
- (5) It is bounded to the east by the seaward limit of the United Kingdom territorial sea between the co-ordinates 58°38′46″ north latitude, 02°30′46″ west longitude and 57°53′31″ north latitude, 01°54′51″ west longitude.
- (6) It is bounded to the south-east by the line joining the following co-ordinates $57^{\circ}41'36''$ north latitude, $02^{\circ}03'02''$ west longitude and $57^{\circ}53'31''$ north latitude, $01^{\circ}54'51''$ west longitude.

The Scottish marine region for the North East

- (4) It is bounded to the north-west by the line joining the co-ordinates 57°41′36″ north latitude, 02°03′02″ west longitude and 57°53′31″ north latitude, 01°54′51″ west longitude.
- (5) It is bounded to the east by the seaward limit of the United Kingdom territorial sea between the co-ordinates $57^{\circ}53'31''$ north latitude, $01^{\circ}54'51''$ west longitude and $56^{\circ}44'09''$ north latitude, $01^{\circ}57'11''$ west longitude.
- (6) It is bounded to the south by the line between the co-ordinates $56^{\circ}45'26''$ north latitude, $02^{\circ}25'26''$ west longitude and $56^{\circ}44'09''$ north latitude, $01^{\circ}57'11''$ west longitude, defined by sequentially joining the following co-ordinates—

- (3) It is bounded to the west by the MHWS of the mainland of Scotland between the coordinates $56^{\circ}45'26''$ north latitude, $02^{\circ}25'26''$ west longitude and $55^{\circ}48'42''$ north latitude, $02^{\circ}01'54''$ west longitude.
- (4) It is bounded to the north by the line between the co-ordinates 56°45′26″ north latitude, 02°25′26″ west longitude and 56°44′09″ north latitude, 01°57′11″ west longitude, defined by sequentially joining the co-ordinates set out below—

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
EXPLANATORY NOTE

The Order makes provision as to which Scottish marine region outlying parts of the Scottish marine area belong.
