14/01	Update on Police Scotland's annual audit into recorded crime: National Crime Registrar to circulate paper on latest audit results and to confirm process for publishing this information.
14/02	HMICS Update / Plans for Crime Audit 2020: HMICS to request feedback on audit plan from board members and to circulate final plan for the audit to the Board.
14/03	Recorded Crime Consultation: Consultation sub-group to consider potential changes to the presentation of the National Statistics, and the timings for deliverability. To present proposals to the next Board meeting in October.
14/04	Progress towards new Crime Recording System: <b>Police Scotland</b> to provide next Board meeting with an update on the roll out of a national Crime Recording System. <b>JAS</b> to invite Police Scotland Core Operational Solutions (COS) team to next Board meeting to provide an update.
14/05	Switching crime statistics from ScOMIS to SEBP: Justice Analytical Services and Police Scotland to continue engagement on the transition from ScOMIS to SEBP, in particular validation checks and timescale for implementation.
14/06	Office for Statistics Regulation compliance check SCRB members to support JAS in the refresh of the Recorded Crime National Statistics bulletin and associated user guide.
14/07	Recording Practice for Children in Care Pilot <b>Police Scotland</b> to provide the next Board meeting with a further update on the Children in Care pilot.
14/08	<u>Crime committed across national borders/HMICS rec 5</u> <b>Crime Registrars</b> to amend the SCRS to include the recording of a crime or offence for all cases where the perpetrator is confirmed to be outwith the UK, with the exception of those cases transferred to another UK Police Force (from 1 <sup>st</sup> April 2020).
14/09	Categorisation of recorded crime outcomes <b>Police Scotland</b> to liaise with COS team on timescales and feasibility of implementing any changes to the categorisation of recorded crime outcomes. To provide an associated update to the Board.

	Police Scotland to publish the 2020-21 SCRS manual, following
	any final comments from Board members.

## Outcomes:

An update on progress with the above actions was considered at the subsequent Board meeting in March 2021.

Six of the actions have been completed (14/02, 14/04, 14/05, 14/07, 14/08 and 14/10).

Following the meeting in February 2020, analytical resources were re-assigned to support the provision of more frequent statistics for users on how Covid-19 and measures taken to restrict its spread had impacted on crime or other justice related metrics. As such, further progress on the remaining four actions (14/01, 14/03, 14/06 and 14/09) will be taken forward through the Board's 2021-22 work plan.
