

Out Of Hours Urgent Care

- In relation to redesign access to services was the main theme:
 - Much stronger concern from NEF
- North East Fife themes were then different from the rest of Fife:
 - Patient safety
 - Service provision
- The Rest of Fife themes were:
 - Improvement
 - Service provision







From the consultation > An Addendum to the Option Appraisal to address concerns for NEF

- Develop options with stakeholders
- Arrange workshops: 30% public staff managers
 - weighted to the area/communities concerned
 - informed standard briefing session beforehand
- Seek Consensus scoring
- Sense check with the rest of Fife
- Develop revised proposal based on preferred option from consultation
