West HUB RRTP Progress Summary

West HUB partners continue to meet on a 6 weekly basis, areas of focus include continuing work to develop the National Housing Options Tool Kit, monitoring performance across housing options and homeless indicators agreed by the HUB, agreeing priority actions for 2020 and monitoring implementation of prevent 1 guidance which should aid performance monitoring/comparison.

RRTP has emerged as a significant focus of the HUB over the last year with updates now featuring as a regular agenda item.

RRTP Co-ordinators across West HUB have now established links and a programme of meetings to discuss the detail of local authority plans and consider any opportunities for joint working. We are aware this may be in addition to a national arrangement and can review our position at a later date.

Common themes across RRTP's are as follows:

- Actions to increase support available, both in terms of preventative activity and response to homelessness are progressing with internal appointments now in place or nearing start dates and a similar position for commissioned services
- Housing First caseloads are increasing
- Capacity to support tenants within the private sector has increased as has support to aid access to this housing market
- Homeless backlogs have decreased in areas, as have timescales to rehouse homeless applicants
- Local letting plans are in place in areas and temporary accommodation planning processes have been reviewed
- Increasing numbers of temporary accommodation units have been "flipped" to permanent tenancies
- Housing pathway plans are being further developed/trialled
- Housing Options approaches/response services are being further developed to increase focus on early intervention
- There are examples of partnership working developing approaches and pathway plans

- Increasing lets to homeless households across social housing sector
- North Lanarkshire have developed a Home's First team working in partnership with Health & Social Care to update as a multi agency team.
- Glasgow City Council have tendered for Homeless Alliance 10 year commissioning framework.

	 Work underway to appoint an officer who will work in partnership with housing and the HSCP to coordinate the provision of joint homelessness and housing support services that can fulfil the objectives underpinning the RRTP and work towards developing a corporate homelessness strategy. We have had initial high level meetings to kick start this work and aim to make further progress over the next few months. Currently working with the HSCP to review housing support services and existing young persons supported accommodation project. Board established and project plan in flight.
	Homeless Prevention and Housing Options
	 In order to meet our outcome for preventing people from becoming homeless in the first place, we have been developing our housing options service and ensuring that new housing advice staff are able to adequately deliver Housing Options. As part of this we have: Developed a new set of Housing Options procedures and associated guides. We have developed this in consultation with staff and management ensuring that policy and practice is articulated correctly. Guides include how to book, deliver, and follow up interviews as per Scottish Government guidance standards. It also includes how to upload customer data on to Prevent1 and what the next steps are (including making homeless applications). We have gone through a period of self-assessment for SNSIAP accreditation in order to prepare for peer review and we anticipate that we will be in a position in the next coming months to go through peer review. Shelter Training The vast majority of staff who deliver housing advice are going through Shelter Housing Law Type II training and are 50% through the course. Additionally, all staff have undergone training on Private Residential Tenancies. We have worked alongside HSCP colleagues and Women's Aid to work on the development of the Council's Domestic Abuse policy. We now have a named person for all women accessing the service who have experienced domestic abuse. We have introduced a new process for capturing, monitoring and measuring how we deliver Type 1 advice and assistance (active assistance in signposting and referring to agencies which does not require casework). Capturing this information will allow us to quantify low level housing options assistance which customers are approaching the service with to understand future demand.
