The meeting began with an update on the development of an infographic, aimed to capture regularly updated data from schools in Scotland, and to be published shortly. The group welcomed the news that school attendance amongst pupils has begun to rise again after the fall since start of the autumn term.

The group also discussed updates on teaching and support staff numbers across Scotland, highlighting that challenges vary in rural and urban areas, and the importance of Test and Protect for school staff. An update was also provided on the work underway by GTCS to secure increased numbers of re-registered teachers.

In relation to guidance updates, it was highlighted that a consistent approach to sharing information on cases or outbreaks of COVID-19 in schools should be strengthened. Colleagues agreed to work together to urgently finalise guidance on this.

Education Scotland provided an update on the continuing work to develop the national e-learning offer. Teaching staff are receiving training on new systems and resources each week, and there is positive feedback from the sector on numbers of staff and students enrolled, particularly as a growing number of subjects are covered.

SQA then provided an update on work underway to identify best options for the 2021 exam diet. Modifications and contingency plans are currently being considered, which take into account feedback received to an SQA consultation. The group recognised the pressing need to reach decisions on the exam diet, but agreed to await the outcome of the Priestley Review before finalising plans.

Finally, the Deputy First Minister confirmed that officials are working to appoint a representative of the Scottish Youth Parliament to join the CERG group.
