School holidays

The Deputy First Minister raised the issue of possibly extending the school Christmas holidays across Scotland. He highlighted that scientific guidance advised against making any changes, but recognised that others may have different views.

Some group members raised counter arguments, including the impact on school staff should there be an outbreak in the final few days of term. There was recognition of the impact of contact tracing on the workload of school leaders, and the need for clarity on how this system would continue into the school holidays.

Surveillance data

Public Health Scotland provided an update on the weekly figures that show a decline in the number of cases amongst children.

It was also shared that the cases across the general population are also declining, which is expected to have a positive impact for schools.

Union representatives raised the number of cases in the teaching population, which is currently not comparable to other government figures.

National qualifications

Following the decision to cancel National 5 exams in 2021, the decision on Highers and Advanced Highers remained under review. SQA presented the work of the National Qualifications Working Group looking into viable options for Higher and Advanced Higher certification in 2021. Key points included the importance of fair and credible delivery, equality for learners, the role of schools, colleges and their staff, the appeals process, and the importance of clear communication with learners, parents and schools.

Group members raised the importance of timely decision making, and requested for teacher workload to be kept in mind throughout planning.
