**NOTE.**—In the interests of economy, and in accordance with the practice now being generally adopted by H.M. Stationery Office, the statistical tables, which formerly were printed as part of the Board's Annual Report, have this year for the first time been published separately. Certain changes have also been made in the form of the tables, particularly in Table B., No. II., where the method of showing the catch mainly according to the Fishery Districts where landed, which dates from a period when operations were more restricted in area than is now the case, and when catches were taken for the most part just off the coast where they were brought ashore, having been modified in favour of a system by which the catch and value from the different fishing regions, and the total contributions of the various methods of capture, are clearly brought out, while at the same time the information as to the places of landing is to a large extent retained.
