## Covid-19 Education Recovery Group - Infographic

## In the week ending 9th May

 2021:- The rate of testing was 523.7 per 100,000 children and young people aged 2 17 years.
- The percentage of tests that were positive was 3.8\% in those aged 2-17 years; a decrease from 4\% last week.
- The identified COVID-19 positive cases reflected a rate of 21.4 cases per 100,000 2-4 year olds, 37.5 cases per 100,000 511 year olds 40.3 per 100,000 12-15 year olds and 43.6 cases per 100,000 16-17 year olds. The rate of cases per 100,000 of the general population was 25.2.


## On $11^{\text {th }}$ May:

- Attendance in local authority schools was 92.3\%, whilst the percentages of openings recorded as pupils not in school (non Covid-19 reasons) was 6.8\%, and for not in school (Covid-19 related reasons) was 0.8\%.
- 6,031 pupils were not in school either all or part of the day because of Covid19 related reasons.

- 1,072 staff were absent due to Covid-19 related reasons, of which, 634 were teaching staff and 438 were other schoolbased staff.
- 80,525 children were attending a childcare setting and 757 had a Covid-19 related absence. Note that not all open settings completed the survey and that these figures are an underestimate of the actual number of open settings and children attending.
- This week, 277 (1.3\%) childcare staff were absent due to Covid-19 related reasons [based on a 52\% response rate].
