
 There have been 10,952 children and young people aged 2-17 years in Scotland who have tested positive for COVID-19 since the start of the outbreak.


In the week ending 3rd January 2021:

- There were 1,235
 children and young
 people aged 2-17 years in
 Scotland who tested
 positive for COVID-19,
 among the 4,417 children
 and young people who
 were tested.
- The identified COVID-19 positive cases reflected a rate of 73.1 cases per 100,000 2-4 year olds, 102.1 cases per 100,000 5-11 year olds, 146.7 per 100,000 12-13 year olds, 165.3 per 100,000 14-15 year olds and 302.5 cases per 100,000 16-17 year olds. The rate of cases per 100,000 of the general population was 268.5.

On 12th January:


- The overall percentage of pupils in attendance in local authority schools was 6.7% (9.3% in Primary schools, 3.1% in Secondary schools and 16.7% in Special schools).
- 2,071 staff were absent due to Covid-19 related reasons, of which, 1,082 were teaching staff and 989 were other schoolbased staff.








Rate per 100,000 population of positive COVID-19 cases across NHS Scotland,

- 22,290 staff were physically in school, of which, 9,722 were teaching staff and 12,568 were other school-based staff.
- 11,165 children were attending a childcare setting and 317 had a Covid-19 related absence. Note that not all open settings completed the survey and that these figures are an underestimate of the actual number of open settings and children attending.
- 597 (4.2%) childcare staff were absent due to Covid-19 related reasons [based on a 39% response rate].
