
 There have been 12,123 children and young people aged 2-17 years in Scotland who have tested positive for COVID-19 since the start of the outbreak.




- There were 1,169

 Scotland who tested
 positive for COVID-19,
 among the 4,507 children
 and young people who
 were tested.
- The identified COVID-19 positive cases reflected a rate of 69.0 cases per 100,000 2-4 year olds, 97.6 cases per 100,000 5-11 year olds, 126.9 per 100,000 12-13 year olds, 166.2 per 100,000 14-15 year olds and 285.8 cases per 100,000 16-17 year olds. The rate of cases per 100,000 of the general population was 277.7.


On 19th January:


- The overall percentage of pupils in attendance in local authority schools was 7.2% (10.0% in Primary schools, 3.1% in Secondary schools and 17.5% in Special schools).
- 27,782 staff were physically in school, of which, 12,430 were teaching staff and 15,352 were other school-based staff.

- 2,146 staff were absent due to Covid-19 related reasons, of which, 1,082 were teaching staff and 1,064 were other schoolbased staff.
- 18,567 children were attending a childcare setting and 545 had a Covid-19 related absence. Note that not all open settings completed the survey and that these figures are an underestimate of the actual number of open settings and children attending.
- 654 (4.1%) childcare staff were absent due to Covid-19 related reasons [based on a 46% response rate].
