

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### Comments

I consider that the Sustainability Appraisal fails to address adequately a number of points.

- SPAs are part of the network, yet a recent extension of SPAs into the marine area has not been accompanied by management measures to meet their conservation objectives. Thus, part of the network is already failing to address "sustainability" objectives. Conservation objective-driven management measures should apply to all the network.
- The Fair Isle community does not feel that enough recognition has been given to the benefits to coastal communities beyond oil, fishing & renewable energy. Fair Isle depends hugely on wildlife tourism, much of it linked to the marine environment.
- 3. Protecting single sites for priority features is only a first step. Modern thinking recognises connectivity and an ecosystem approach to conservation planning. Such an approach calls for a series of sites and supporting measures to protect the integrity of sites representative of typical (as opposed to rare) high quality habitats and biotopes. Without this the sustainability aspiration is undermined.

### Comments

The MPA Overview recognises the growing wildlife sector as a direct benefit; and other benefits mentioned include protecting habitats, fish nurseries, etc. Yet an MPA selection based solely on a very restricted list of priority features – does not address in any way these additional elements. Thus, though a welcome development, the MPA network derived from this process will fall well short of being a complete or ecologically coherent network.

This document states that MPAs will be managed to "achieve their conservation objectives". This is both commendable and necessary.

However, the Fair Isle experience of SPA designation is that the extension seawards, without management measures to meet conservation objectives, is just a paper exercise and thus fails to meet requirements under the European Birds Directive. Such shortcomings need to be addressed and brought into line with the commitment given in this document for managing the MPA sites.

### Comments

In all our years of trying to flag up the essential requirement for Fair Isle waters that they are managed sustainably for the socioeconomic (as opposed to the environmental) well-being of the island community we have consistently failed to get that message across. There is still a perception that benefits derived from the sea revolve uniformly in what can be taken from it (fish, oil, energy etc.). For many small coastal communities a rich environment and fully functioning ecosystem underpin the entire economic structure – in our case particularly nature tourism, arts, crafts and cultural identity with the sea.
