

Yes √ No □ Designation: Kyle Rhea should have been included in the MPA designation to complement its SAC status. It has 3 PMFs just out with the southern boundary of the SAC: burrowed mud, laminaria hyperborea and funiculina quadrangularis. The SNH report 446 described the South end of Kyle Rhea thus: "Funiculina quadrangularis became abundant over a wide area". It was also described as "dense" It is a PMF, an UK Biodiversity Action Plan Priority Species, on the OSPAR Threatened and Declining list, A Species of Conservation Concern and in the Habitats Directive Annex 1. It is nationally scarce. Should the SAC not be extended to encompass it? At the very least the MPA? It may well be represented elsewhere via MPAs but does OSPAR not require further protection? – i.e. it regards MPAs as making a contribution to protection of species and habitats, not as being the whole solution. The tidal rapids are used as a feeding ground by several other EPS/PMF mobile species such as basking shark, minke whale, black guillemot to name but a few. The

majority (if not all) of the West Coast bottlenose dolphin community (excluding Barra) were observed and recorded here this year feeding in the tide. If Skye to Mull is designated, this leaves the Sound of Sleat – and Kyle Rhea – as an enclave between two MPAs. This does not seem ecologically linked or coherent and could

result in displacement activity.
