

Local vessels have fished sustainably within that site for over 50 years and the fact that the identified features remain within the site is a clear indication that current levels of fishing effort is being pursued in balance with the marine features for which the site is designated. Zoning of the areas currently fished by prawn trawlers and scallop dredgers should be identified to ensure that modern technology is used to avoid the designated features within the MPA. The main threat and risk to the features would be from larger and more powerful mobile vessels entering the area and management measures should identify a maximum tonnage and horsepower for vessels operating within the proposed MPA site. Management measures for the site should be discussed in further detail

with vessels skippers that currently fish within the proposed site. Exclusion

of mobile vessels form the sites would result in displacement of significant effort onto other areas that are considered to be fully-exploited and will result in economic loss to both the catching and processing sectors.

A considerable number of Western Isles based prawn trawlers and scallop dredgers operate on a seasonal basis with the proposed MPA site. All the vessels are low horse powered vessels that have been fishing that area for nearly 50 years. The features within the site demonstrate that the current levels of fishing effort are not impacting on the features for which the site is being designated. Zoning of the mobile tows can be easily agreed with skippers so that they can avoid the features within the site and that would be a sensible management plan for that area. The main threat would be from large tonnage and large horse powered vessels coming to fish within the site and part of the management should introduce a tonnage and horsepower cap on vessels operating within the area. Displacement of current mobile gear activity should be avoided at all costs as that would simply divert effort onto other areas that are fully-exploited and possible create additional gear conflict amongst static gear vessels. Detailed discussions should take place with skippers of vessels operating within the area so that zoning arrangements can be agreed to protect the features for which the site is being designated.
