
This release follows the ONS monthly release of Regional Labour market Statistics in the UK

This months data are presented for the 3 months to January 2020, compared with the quarter before (August to October 2019) and compared with a year before (November to January 2019). Please note percentage point changes are based on unrounded data.

The employment rate in Scotland was 74.9 per cent. This is 0.4 percentage points up on the quarter and 0.4 percentage points down on the year.

The UK employment rate was 76.5 per cent. This is 0.3 percentage points up on the quarter and 0.4 percentage points up on the year.


The unemployment rate in Scotland was 3.5 per cent. This is 0.2 percentage points down on the quarter and 0.1 percentage points up on the year.

The UK unemployment rate was 3.9 per cent. This is 0.2 percentage points upon the quarter and no change on the year.

The inactivity rate in Scotland was 22.3 per cent. This is 0.3 percentage points down on the quarter and 0.3 percentage points up on the year.


The UK inactivity rate was 20.4 per cent. This is 0.4 percentage points down on the quarter and 0.3 percentage points down on the year.

Reliability of these estimates

When estimates are based on a sample of the population, confidence limits can be used to assess the range of values that the true value lies between. 95% confidence intervals are included in T1

What does the 95% confidence limit mean?

If, for example, we have an LFS estimate and confidence limit of 63% +/- 0.27%, this means that 19 times out of 20 we would expect the true rate to lie between 62.73% and 63.27%. Only in exceptional circumstances (1 in 20 times) would we expect the true rate to be outside the confidence interval around the LFS estimate. The smaller the confidence limits, the more reliable the estimate.
